


Composition

- 1. Use sketchbooks and color theory to compose a visual representation of an idea. Add written elements to the sketchbook.
- 2. Study the composition of stained glass art, as well as the techniques for cutting and piecing together the glass. Create a written "stained glass" composition with each element of the written piece being added in to the whole.

Part to Whole

- Read Pezzettino as a way to understand each part is important to the whole (mosaics) and create a musical piece in fractions that equal a whole. Can also be used during planning/ PLC.
- 4. Use trio dances to showcase part-to-whole with the body to create a new singular form.









Planning/Assessment

- 5. Consider organizing all of your collaborative planning ideas and resources into a "creative kit" that you pull out as you plan integrated lessons to spark your collaborative conversations.
- 6. Great self-assessment for middle schoolers, but could also be adapted to any age level. Create a storyboard that has a headline and image of the assessment criteria you set.
