incomparable	unable to be compared; totally different from anything else
vaudeville	A type of entertainment popular in the US in the early 20th century, featuring a mixture of specialty acts such as comedy, song and dance
devastated	having a sense of severe and overwhelming shock or grief
ceramics	pots and other items made from clay hardened by heat
troops	soldiers or armed forces
larynx	The hollow, muscular organ forming an air passage to the lungs and holding the vocal cords in humans and other mammals; the voice box.
octave	A type of musical interval, or the measure of the distance between two notes with the same name. One note has a pitch that is exactly double the pitch of the other note.
diction	the style of speaking or singing with great enunciation, very clearly
rendition	a performance or interpretation, especially of a dramatic role or piece of music
debut	a person's first appearance or performance in a particular role
pantomimes	a form of entertainment in which performers express meaning through gestures accompanied by music.
accolades	expressions of praise or admiration
notoriety	being famous or well known for something that has been done
producer	a person responsible for the financial aspects of making of a movie or for staging a play, concert, or other piece of entertainment
