swaddled	wrap a newborn infant tightly with cloth to prevent free movement
congregated	to come together and assemble in large numbers, like a crowd
ornamental	decorative
prodigy	a young child who has extraordinary talent or ability

muted	soft, low intensity
somber	gloomy, depressing, or dismal
innovative	introduce something new or different
neoclassicism	an 18th and 19th century art movement that was inspired by the classical art and culture of Ancient Greece and Rome
