FIXING UNREALISTIC TEACHER EXPECTATIONS

THE JEANS PASS ECONOMY

The Problem: Schools rely on gimmicks like jeans passes instead of funding basic needs.

Solutions:

- Schools should budget for supplies instead of charging teachers.
- PTAs & community partners can create a teacher appreciation fund.
- Fundraising? Let students run it as a **learning experience**, not charge teachers.

FUNDRAISING FIASCOS

<u>The Problem:</u> Teachers are forced to fundraise for classroom materials, even PD.

Solutions:

- Organize collaborative arts integration fundraisers.
- Districts should **equitably allocate funds** so teachers aren't scrambling.
- Mini-grants within school budgets can replace teacher-led fundraising.

INFINITE DUTIES

<u>The Problem:</u> Hall duty, bus duty, supervision... when do teachers actually teach?

Solutions:

- Hire additional support staff for non-teaching roles.
- Offer comp time or stipends for extra responsibilities.
- **Rotate duty assignments** fairly instead of overloading the same people.

JUST ONE MORE THING...

<u>The Problem:</u> Teachers are bogged down by redundant paperwork & micromanagement.

Solutions:

- Trust teachers as professionals! Lesson plans should be guidelines, not essays.
- Automate tracking systems to reduce redundant paperwork.
- Weekly check-ins, not daily plan submissions, save time without sacrificing quality.

TESTING CHAOS

<u>The Problem:</u> Testing takes away instructional time & adds stress for little benefit.

Solutions:

- Reduce over-testingb by using portfolio-based assessments instead.
- Allow classroom-based assessments to count for student progress.
- Support **teacher unions advocating for legislation** to cut excessive testing.

BIG-PICTURE SOLUTIONS



Transparency: Open budget meetings so teachers see where funds go.



Legislation: Support bills that prioritize classrooms over testing companies.



Community Support: Businesses & parents can help fill funding gaps.
